Class News

Van Gogh

Hope you have all had a good week! We are nearly there, the children are tired and ready for a break well deserved break!

Phonics

Please continue to consolidate all the Phase 2 sounds and work on segmenting and blending, hearing initial/middle/end sounds and rhyme. It is also important that the children are applying their sounds not only to reading but writing as well. Please encourage them to start writing CVC words and simple sentences, E.g. The cat on the mat. Dad has a cap. A pin on a map.

Reading

We will not be sending books home for Christmas but encourage that you continue to read and share books with your child. To support reading, please continue to learn sight reading tricky words alongside the sounds.

<u>Maths</u>

We have continued to work on mathematical vocabulary related to addition, learning how to read/write simple number sentences and make up stories using objects and drawings.

This week we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and will be consolidating all numbers to 5:

Conservation of a number: Number of objects in a set does not change even when they are moved around.

Composition of a number: Number are made of two or more other smaller numbers involving a 'part' and a 'whole'. Learning to 'see' a whole number and its parts at the same time.

Subitise: Look at a group of objects and realis how many there re without counting.

We are consolidating all the learning for numbers 1-5. Please support your child to continue to reinforce previous learning.

<u>Topic</u>

We are continuing to learn about Christmas traditions.
