If you believe your child has particular needs that meet the criteria for adjustments to be made to the test you must discuss it with me during the first week of next half term. If however you decide that you do not want your child to sit the test please notify the school in writing by Friday 8th September 2023.


Bucks Music Trust

Thank you, for all of you who attended the workshare evening. I hope you enjoyed sharing the children work. The sun has been shining and the children have really enjoyed being outdoors. We have been doing some DIY and thank you to Mr P have now got out own little tent to play in.

Phonics:

This week we have been consolidating when we use the *ff, ll, ss, zz* and *ck* in a word. The children have learnt if a word has a vowel in the middle there will be a diagraph at the end e.g. huff, cuff, mess, duck etc. If there is a digraph in the middle then the word end with a single consonant e.g. curl, turf, snail, bark etc.

Reading:

It has been great to see the children picking up books and having a go at independently reading, I am really proud of them. They are continuing to enjoy sharing non-fiction texts. So please continue to share books with the children as well as hearing them read. Will be continue to learn about the key features of Non-Fiction text e.g. Contents Page, Glossary, and Index Page etc. The children have really enjoyed learning key facts about different things e.g. sharks, plants, occupations etc.

Writing:

This week we have written the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We also used picture prompt cards (Build a Story Cards) for the children to write their own stories. I highly recommend these as the children can choose cards representing key features of a story e.g. setting, characters, props, actions etc. This is also great way for the children to use their imagination to discuss, share and write an imaginative piece of work. This enables them to extend sentences by using adjectives, start to use a capital letter at the start of a sentence, a full stop at the end and consistently apply the Phase 3 sounds and tricky words in their writing. Please continue to encourage the children to write at home.

Maths:

This week we introduced symmetry as this tied in with the butterflies. We are going to continue exploring measure further by comparing weights and size of objects and consolidate 'time' as a form of measure e.g. how long does it take to run across the playground.

Topic:

With the butterflies hatching, we got a bit carried away with learning all about symmetry using different mediums. Next week we will use the same techniques as Eric Carle to produce collages of animals. We will also continue to talk about keeping healthy and looking after our teeth.

Next week in English, we will be reading, performing and writing our own seasonal poems and tongue twisters, linking this to our learning in science of the weather in spring.

In maths, we will continue to revise telling the time to half an hour, quarter of an hour and Year 2 will continue to work on the nearest 5 minutes. Please also practise this at home. We will also be working on counting up to find a difference between two numbers either by using a number line, drawing our own number line or doing this mentally.

In science, we will continue to collect, record and compare our weather data and think about the importance of staying safe in the sun. In art we will closely look at leaves and natural objects, making sketches to use for a print and in PSHE we will be thinking about when and how to ask for help with feelings and also thinking about how we can help others with their feelings.

Forest school for Year 2 will be on Monday and reading books will be changed Tuesday morning.

Hockney

English


Children started their new topic in English this week and enjoyed learning about different countries around the world. They learnt strategies to retrieve key information from a text using skimming and scanning. We also looked at similarities and differences between countries.

Maths

Year 3 have been solving word problems covering time.

Year 4 have been learning to convert 12-hour clock time to 24-hour clock and using different strategies to help them solve a problem, for example using number lines.

Both year groups have had the chance to work together in problem solving and supporting one another to find efficient ways to tackle a challenging problem. Any additional practice you can give them with the telling the time will go a long way!



Topic

We got our scientific investigations back underway this week continuing with living things and their habitats. We started our lesson looking at the way habitats can change and cause danger to living things i.e. deforestation, urbanisation, global warming and intensive farming. As a class we discussed how we could make a difference at school and at home; recycling, walking, cycling and reducing our food miles were just a few of the ideas we shared.



Outside the classroom, we looked at the habitats within Chenies School. Children took photos of their finds and made observations of how these habitats were supporting living things. The wildlife area, pond and large tree stumps were popular choices along with The Bugford Arms Hotel and the outdoor hut. Our next topic will be animals including humans.

In Design Technology children continued with their mosaic tiles. They have drawn their mosaic design adding the tile effect and some colour. After half term, they will be completing their masterpiece – watch this space!



History- Children have enjoyed designing a poster showing how Romans changed Britain and we looked at why the two firsts attempts to invade Britain was unsuccessful.

Assessments

Next week children will be having assessments in maths and English. Please reassure them that it is nothing to worry about and to try their best as they always do. It is for us to know which areas they need support and put interventions in place.
