Monet Class News

In Literacy we will be continuing with poetry and composing our own poems.

In maths we will be adding and subtracting and solving problems.

In topic work we will be learning about real life superheroes from today and the past and learning about the life and work of Florence Nightingale.

We will also be working hard on our Christmas production.

Hockney Class News

In Maths, the children will continue to be focussing on written methods of addition and subtraction, and using a mix of written and mental methods to work out problems.

In English we have started out non-fiction unit, looking at report writing. Next week will focus on the journalistic language and comparing it to other types of non-fiction texts.

In Science we will be continuing our unit of work, looking at humans and the digestive system. This week the focus will be on the functions of different organs .

As part of topic work the children will start looking at history of sports, looking at how they changed throughout time and what their impact was. In geography, the children will be learning about different modern European countries, starting with Spain.

Hepworth Class News

English

We are continuing to read Goodnight Mr Tom, which the children are enjoying. This is a quality text that is giving us lots of opportunity for discussion and comprehension. We will be using the text to do some writing based around character and setting as well as some grammar skills using relative clauses and modal verbs.

Maths

We are starting the week by looking at money - focussing on giving change. This is a great opportunity for some real life practice with your children - getting them to work out what the change will be if you're out and about doing any shopping. We will then move on to looking at short multiplication. We talk about the importance of learning tables across a range of maths topics - but this one is particularly key! Do look at different apps and games that could help your child with these - there are hundreds out there.

Topic

In topic we will be researching and exploring the importance of women in World War 2 and the roles they took on during this time.

Our PE lessons with Mrs Wilson have seen us start learning the 'Lindy Hop' dance which the children thoroughly enjoyed last week. The song we are using is 'In The Mood' by Glenn Miller if your child wants to practice their 'step, step, triple step' at home!

Also, another reminder for full PE kits to be in school please!

As our work on the human body in Science draws to a close, we have discovered some useful apps for looking closely at what we are eating. Search Change4Life to find a barcode scanner to look at what is in the food products you buy and a smart recipe app with lots of great meal and snack ideas and recipes to keep your bodies healthy.
