Maths

Year 3 – Children will be starting the summer term with fractions. They will be learning to add and subtract fractions as well as finding fractions of an amount.

Year 4- Children will continue with their learning of decimals. They will be comparing, ordering and rounding decimals.

English

Next term we will be reading *Christophe's Story*, which is about a boy who wants to share his experience with his school and tell them why he had to leave Rwanda.

Topic

Next term in science, we will be studying Living things and their habitats.

In History, we will be learning about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain.

In our computing sessions, we will be developing our word processing skills using Microsoft word.

Physical and mental well-being will be our new topic in PSHE. We will discuss Health choices and habits. We will also explore what effects our feelings.
