Monet

The children in Monet Class have had a fantastic week reading lots of stories, working hard on their writing, doing lots of practical number work and being kind to one another.

Next week we will be planning, writing and editing a letter in English. We will be focusing on capital letters for names, finger spaces and full stops. We will also be reading lots more stories!

In Maths we will be identifying coins and their value, making amounts and telling the time to o'clock and half hour.

We will be finding out about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores in Science and in History we will be discovering who Florence Nightingale was.

We will also be using colour in Art to represent our moods and feelings and talking about the importance of respect in PSHE.

Home Learning

Please read with your child daily. This should be their reading books plus other books from home/library books.

Log in to Active Learn to access a Maths game related to the activities we have been doing in class this week.

Each week Monet will have five words to practise reading and spelling. These will be taken from the 'common exception words' (tricky words) for their year group .These are words that cannot be easily sounded out. This week's words are below.

Next week we are looking forward to continuing our work on Ancient Egypt, focusing on pyramids, asking questions such as why and how were they built?

The pyramids are something that has always fascinated us so we are keen to find out more about them!

In Science we have been looking at food chains and thinking about how important they are to various habitats. Next week we shall be moving on to think about skeletons within animals and humans, trying to understand how they work and just why they are so important.

In English, having finished reading our fiction story 'Storm' we have lots of questions that we want to ask of the text! It was a very mysterious story that ended on a bit of a cliffhanger and some of us were a little disappointed with this. So next week we are going to be thinking about where we would have liked the story to go and how the author carefully created a setting using descriptive sentences that would throw us as the reader into this mysterious world.

In RE next week we are going to continue to delve into the importance of special books in different religions. We are looking at how stories within these sacred texts help the followers of that religion feel closer to God. We have been looking at important stories within the Christian faith for the last few weeks but will move on to think about stories within Sikhism and Hinduism in the weeks to come.

In Computing we have begun to look at e-safety, learning how to keep ourselves safe online and how to be responsible online. In the coming weeks we will be focusing on what information we should be sharing and what should be kept private.

We hope you have a lovely weekend and look forward to seeing you all again next week.

Hepworth

We have had another wonderful week in Hepworth with elections for house-captains, school council and eco-warriors taking place as well as a lot of hard work in class.

<u>English</u>

Next week in English, we will be continuing with our text 'Friend or Foe' including work on writing a new scene and completing comprehension activities and a depth focus on the text.

Our grammar work will include looking closely at relative clauses and our spelling work will be on the suffixes '-tial' and '-cial' and our key words for the week are: eight, island, listen, often, loose, sentence. These spellings can be practiced using the Sir Linkalot website - https://app.sirlinkalot.org/

<u>Maths</u>

Maths next week is focussing on rounding numbers and then towards the end of the week we will explore prime numbers and square numbers.

Other Subjects

Year 6 will have Forest School on Monday - please remember they should wear trousers or leggings, with their usual school uniform on top.

On Monday afternoon, year 5 will explore different sewing techniques and listen to, discuss and learn some Dame Vera Lynn songs from the time of World War Two. In Spanish we will continue learning about foods, our likes and dislikes along with talking about healthy and unhelathy foods.

We will continue exploring electrical circuits in science with an investigation about the brightness of bulbs.

In topic we will be locating WW2 key countries on a map and exploring more about the war. We will continue to find out about diversity in religion by looking more at different denominations of religion in our local community. We will be looking at different bridges and sequencing a routine in our Thursday PE lesson. Our PSHE lesson will focus

on how to recognise if a friendship is making us feel unsafe, worried, or uncomfortable and when and how to seek support in relation to friendships.

Homework

Whilst we are on the final stages of updating Google Classroom for the new classes and children, homework for this week is detailed below/sent home as a paper copy.

Spellings:

The grammar technique that the children need to apply to their written English homework (see paper copy sent home) is the use of standard/non-standard English as taught in Friday's SPAG lesson.

Maths homework has been allocated on ActiveLearn (<u>www.activelearnprimary.co.uk</u>) which should be completed by Monday. The children have all been reminded how to access and log in to their accounts.
