

The context for schools is continually changing



What is an Academy?

- State-funded school directly funded by the Department for Education
- Launched in 2000, with the aim of boosting struggling schools
- Since 2010 the number of academies has risen rapidly
- Schools rated 'outstanding' or 'performing well' by Ofsted get priority
- Independent of the local authority
- More freedom to decide certain things for themselves, for example, curriculum, finances, term dates and school days
- New Academies must join a Multi Academy Trust (MAT)




The conversion process

Processing AO applications c.16 weeks – and doesn't always result in approval to proceed

Formal process prescribed by DfE c12-16 week process

6-9 month process



ODBST: Trustees


There are currently twelve Trustees appointed by the Members and two ex officio appointments. They are each appointed for the skills they bring to the board.

- Extra costs?




Who makes the decision?

- The governing body is required to consult with interested parties about this decision (but it is not a referendum)
- The decision for your school to become an academy rests with the governing body
- Each party will conduct extensive due diligence to ensure the decision is in the best interests of the pupils and community
- The Regional Schools Commissioner needs to approve an Academy Order (which releases funding for the conversion work)
- Secretary of State for Education executes the conversion with signing and sealing of legal documents
