Class News

Van Gogh

It has been a busy week with the children starting to get very excited with role play area moving into the classroom and being set up as Chinese Restaurant.

Phonics

It has been great to see them continue to consolidate their sounds and apply them in their reading and writing. They have started to ask which alternative sound to use and use the rhymes to help them identify the sound, for example...

Which 'a-e' do we use in the word cake? Split digraph MAKE A CAKE'. Which 'ea' do we use for the word seat? Digraph CUP OF TEA.

Please continue to consolidate all Phase 2/3 sounds and tricky words learnt to date.

<u>Reading</u>: Over the next two weeks we will be learning that reading a story is not always about sitting with a book. We will be retelling stories by acting and dancing. Please to continue read and share books with your child daily.

Writing

The children continue to make good progress in their writing, they are discovering that they can segment and blend to write simple words and sentences. Please continue to encourage them to use their rhymes when writing at home, remember they will use their phonic knowledge to spell words and should be praised for having a go. Remember writing does not always mean sitting at a desk, they can write lists, make tickets, label things etc. This week the children will be writing the Chinese New Year Story.

<u>Maths</u>

This week we will continue to consolidate our numbers to 9 and introduce TEN. We will be looking at TEN as a block and how it needs it ZERO to be a TEN otherwise it would be ONE. The children will be chanting numbers to 20 and above. They will continue to look at more/less using a numberline and independently count 10/more items into a set using 1-1 correspondence. We will be looking at practical addition/subtraction and consolidating our Number Bonds to 10 and begin to partition sets of ten objects and learn pairs to 10. Our snack shop has been a huge success, the children are growing in confidence when paying for their snack using 1p 2p and 5p coins. Please continue to consolidate using coins at home. We will also be introducing the 10p coin.

<u>Topic</u>

Our topic this term is: Chinese New Year - Food from Around the World

The children have enjoyed making paper dragons and tigers. They have created their own art by colouring in outlines of animals using various marks. This week we will revisit the story about Chinese New Year learn about ordinal numbers. We will continue to look at how people celebrate Chinese New Year and compare it to other celebrations. This week the children will use their senses to explore and describe a range of fruit and vegetables. They will be using their observation skills and different mediums to represent their observations e.g. using paints, pastels, and collage to create fruit/vegetable artwork. We will also be opening up our Chinese Restaurant!

Monet

We've had another great week in Monet class thinking about characters in English and making story maps to help us plan our own stories. Next week we will be using our plans to tell our stories orally before beginning to write them.

In Maths we will be continuing to multiply and divide in Year 2, using our knowledge of the 2, 5, and 10 times tables to help us solve word problems. In Year 1 we will be revising what each digit means in a 2-digit number, partitioning 2-digit numbers and making 2-digit numbers using bead strings, tens and ones and number lines. Please look at the maths homework set each week as it is related to the maths we have been doing in class.

In science we will be devising and carrying out our own experiment to test materials in the home. In topic we will be comparing houses 350 years ago to houses today and painting our fantastic coil pots to remember the Great Fire of London and remind us that an event like this won't happen again!

We will also be looking at the work of award winning artist and architect Stephen Watkins who specialises in painting city skylines. I am hoping to create a zoom session with Stephen in the next few weeks. This is a great link to thinking about how London was rebuilt and a super opportunity for the children to ask a real artist and architect their own questions after learning about Christopher Wren. Please take a look at Stephen's work at <u>Art by Stephen</u> Watkins- Contemporary City Skyline-Inspired Art (sjwatkins.com).

Hockney

What a busy week we have had this week! We were treated in Hockney class to a special Anglo-Saxon workshop on Thursday which the children were all very excited about! We learnt about all aspects of their lives and were able to relive the Anglo-Saxon past. We'll include some photographs in next week's newsletter once we've had an opportunity to go through them all as we took so many!

Next week in English we will be planning and writing our own legends. This is the culmination of all of our study into different legends, learning about what the distinctive features of a legend are and really pulling apart the character traits of the heroes and villains. We're very much looking forward to seeing what stories the children tell!

In maths we shall be continuing our work on measures by focusing on calculations using length and measuring perimeter. The Yr 4s in particular will be focusing on calculating perimeter of different shapes, using grids to calculate perimeter and how we must use the provided knowledge within a measurement word problem to work out what the missing knowledge could be.

In our spelling, punctuation and grammar lessons the children have been really engaged with learning all about homophones-words that sound the same but are spelt differently and mean different things according to the context these words are used in. Last week we really focused on basic homophones such as understanding the difference between there, their and they're and next week we shall be stepping this up to learn about more difficult homophones where we really have to think about the sentence we are using the word in to know what spelling to use.

We have not yet begun our Anglo-Saxon settlements but are hoping to do so next week as we have been learning a lot about what these settlements must include. Please do continue to send in any cardboard boxes if you have them-we will always find a use for them!

In our computing lessons we are starting to look at programming really specific commands so that we can complete given tasks rather than just designing something that we may like! The children have been brilliant in these lessons, working really hard to incorporate all the different skills they have learnt studying Scratch to create really successful programs. The children have even gone home and created games themselves to show their newly-acquired skills to the rest of the class. Please do talk to your child about this famous 'Scratch' and get them to show you how it all works.

Homework, as ever, will be on Google Classrooms. We hope you all have a lovely weekend.

Hepworth

The weeks are really whizzing by in Hepworth this half term and the children are working as hard as ever. We've seen lots of the children really pushing themselves to improve their work which is great.

Next week, in English the children are continuing to use Salamander Dream as our text for inspiring our writing tasks.

We will then finish the week off with some focussed comprehension and then our grammar lesson is all about the use of commas to avoid ambiguity and clarify meaning. Our spelling words will be words ending -ence.

In Maths we will be continuing to work on decimals - reading and writing decimals as fractions, as well as ordering and rounding decimals. Towards the end of the week we will round off our learning about decimals with some problem solving activities.

We also have our very exciting Maya workshop on Tuesday which was postponed from a few weeks ago.

In Science we are going to be investigating oxidation changes - looking at how rust is formed and under what conditions. Our PSHE lessons will focus on photos online and on social media and how these may have been edited or altered. In RE we will be learning about what kind of a leader Guru Nanak was.

Nearly all the children handed their homework in for English this week which is a huge improvement! Lots of star points have been given out for the children's writing and we are pleased that the children seem to be taking on a bit more responsibility for ensuring they do this each week. Please remember to support your child with their homework by giving them somewhere quiet to work etc. We are so proud of the children who do their homework every week without fail and we hope this will be all of the children by next week.
