I can't believe we are half way through the term already! Before we know it, summer term will be creeping upon us and we'll be getting ready to move the little ones on to their next stage of learning... scary!

Phonics:

We have introduced the first six digraphs in Phase 3 and the children have found these very tricky. Please continue to work with your child at home to consolidate reading words/sentences with these sounds.

Week 5 oo (look) oo (moon) ar or Tricky words: my you

Week 6 ur ow oi ear Tricky word: they all are

Reading:

It is really important that you are reading with your child or sharing a book every day. This will not only build on their vocabulary and imagination but it will also help with apply their phonics to read and write more complex sentences. Also we would appreciate if all book are in every Thursday so that we can change books that have been read and look at reading records.

Writing:

Over the next few weeks we will be encouraging the children to extend sentences by using adjectives and to start using a capital letter at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end. It is really important you continue to encourage the children to write at home.

Maths:

This week we will continue to consolidate number TEN and 3D shapes.

Topic:

Next week we continue to talk about celebrations... Mother's Day! It is also Science week so we will be doing experiments.

In English next week we will be focusing on nouns, revising adjectives and planning and writing a senses poem. Thank you to those children who brought in their favourite poems to share with the class.

In maths Year 1 will be practising to count in 2s, recognising odd and even numbers, finding doubles up to 12 and halving numbers up to 24. Year 2 will be revising counting in 2s, moving on to recognising multiples of 2, 5 and 10 and solving multiplications using the 2, 5 10 and 3 times tables.

In science we will continue to observe our grass seeds and record what we see. We will then use our knowledge to plant some seeds individually.

In geography we will be continuing to find out more about the different continents and create a poster to represent a chosen continent.

In PSHE we will be continuing to find out about the internet and recognise that some content is factual and some is for entertainment, understanding that not all content may be true. Internet safety will also be discussed throughout.

Maths

Year 3 and Year 4 having been working hard this week understanding fractions. Year 3 have been counting fractions and equivalent fractions on a number line; they have enjoyed it so much we have given them extra work! Year 4 have been pushing their brains to the limit with converting improper fractions and mixed numbers. They haven't asked for any extra work yet, but there is some available!

English

We have thoroughly enjoyed poetry this week! They have looked at a kenning poem and identified how rhyme, alliterations and personifications are used. They have now started their own kenning using riddles and rhymes to keep us all guessing.

Topic

This week in science, Year 4 had their final lesson on sound. They investigated sound proofing materials and put these to the test with their very own sets of ear defenders! Next week Year 4 will be starting Art with a look at Tudor portraits.

In Design Technology, children begun designing their Tudor clothing piece. We saw all sorts of materials being used to add colour and interest to their designs; they will be working on this until the Easter Break.

Next week in Geography, we will be focussing on our local area and use our geographical skills to search for physical and human features in Buckinghamshire

In PSHE, they have discussed why it is important to keep track of money and have looked at an example of a bank statement. They have calculated income and regular outgoings to help budget. Next week they will look at different ways of paying for things and which is more appropriate.

Hepworth

This term seems to be flying by! This week has been relatively 'normal' in Hepworth class, with lots of hard work and good learning taking place across the curriculum.

Next week, in English we will be moving onto narrative poetry under the heading of Tell Me a Story. We will be exploring a poem By St Thomas Water by Charles Causley, which recalls a childhood memory.

In our SPAG lesson we will be focussing on cohesion. Our spellings will be words beginning with sus- and al-.

In Maths, we will be looking at the area and perimeter of squares, rectangles and composite shapes, and year 6 will also focus on the area of triangles and finding the volume. We will also look at circles - learning how to use a protractor to draw these and understanding more about their properties including relationships between their radius, circumference and diameter.

Science this week continues looking at the properties of materials, this time testing them for solubility, hardness, transparency, conductivity and response to magnets. Whilst in computing children will work on sequencing the stories in their animations.

Having finished their mountain compositions in Art, we will now be returning to Music and how it connects us to the environment. In RE we will be considering some 'big' questions - How important is human life? Is human life more important than all other life?

In DT, we will be taking the next steps of our work on shelters by planning and designing our shelters, including drawing diagrams and creating flowcharts and equipment lists.

In PSHE, we will be doing our first of a couple of sessions about money and the role this plays in our lives. We hope you have a wonderful weekend and hope you manage to stay dry in this weather! As ever, please do see us on the playground after school or make an appointment if you have any questions.
