# **Headteacher's News**

### Anti-Bullying week

# **Class News**

## Van Gogh

Hope you have all had a good week!

We have had a busy week preparing for the Remembrance Assembly, learning a poem and making handprint poppies. The children have met number three and look forward to meeting number four next week.

<u>Reading Pack</u>: All the children have now received their reading pack which includes information on how you can help your child with their reading. I have also included a number line, list of 2D/3D shapes, phonics sounds with rhymes and tricky words. This information is for you to keep at home to support your child. The game with sounds and tricky words will be sent out weekly as and when we learn them. These once again are for you for cut up and use as flashcards etc. If you are not sure about any of the information you received, please feel free to contact me.

#### **Phonics**

The children are doing well with segmenting and blending, hearing initial/middle/end sounds and rhyme. We will continue to consolidate Phase 1 and would appreciate if you could continue to work with the children on their Phase 1 targets.

To support reading the children will be learning to sight read the tricky words alongside the sounds. Please use the material sent home last week in their reading pack to continue to reinforce these.

#### <u>Maths</u>

We have continued to work on mathematical vocabulary related to addition, learning how to read/write simple number sentences and make up stories using objects and drawings.

This week we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and will be introducing:

Conservation of a number: Number of objects in a set does not change even when they are moved around.

Composition of a number: Number are made of two or more other smaller numbers involving a 'part' and a 'whole'. Learning to 'see' a whole number and its parts at the same time. Subitise: Look at a group of objects and realis how many there re without counting.

- Number 4
- Counting out three Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals Rectangle (two long straight sides, two short straight sides and four corners) Square (four straight sides and four corners) Using/adding different combination of coins to make 4p ordinal numbers 4<sup>th</sup> Number formation 4 'o'clock.
- Children count 1-10 on a number track (Can say one more/less than a number)
- Days of the week what come before... what comes after...?

#### <u>Topic</u>

This week we have been talking about how different jobs require us to work through the day and night. Next week we will be learning about the importance of 'light' in different cultural celebrations.

# Hockney

Next week is going to be a really busy and exciting week within Hockney class as we will be welcoming an interactive visit from the Oxford Ashmolean museum into our classroom! This special visit on Thursday will focus on the different Ancient Egyptian artefacts within the Ashmolean, with us trying to work out what each artefact is for. We will also have the opportunity to make some Ancient Egyptian toys from clay under the expert guidance of the museum. We shall then have a work share evening on Thursday where the children will be able to share with you all they have learnt and hopefully their clay toys too.

Next week is Anti-bullying week and this shall be our focus within our PSHE lesson. We will be learning about the importance of using kind words and how important it is to stand up for each other. We will be thinking about how we can help ourselves and others who may be being bullied.

In English next week we are beginning to think about writing our own non-fiction texts. We will be learning about the importance of paragraphs in organising our understanding and how breaking text up into appropriately grouped bits of information all works to add to our understanding.

In Computing we will continue to look at the different ways in which children can safely communicate with one another, as this is such a prominent part of our lives. We will be looking at email and other types of online platforms and continue our work on understanding what is and is not an appropriate comment.

We have come to the end of our focus on Bob Marley, with the children performing an excellent instrumental accompaniment to his song 'Three Little Birds'. The children were tasked with picking appropriate instruments that would enhance the rhythm of the piece and add to the tone of the song. They did an excellent job!

# Hepworth

The excitement is mounting now for our class trip to Holdenby House next Thursday. Please remember that we need Hepworth Class in school by **8.20am, ready to leave at 8.30am.** They should arrive in costume, in the role of an evacuee in 1942. All children also need a water bottle and packed lunch for the trip.

### <u>English</u>

We will be completing our 'What is Blood for?' unit next week. Our focus will be around report writing and creating our own page that could be added to the Ebook. We will explore and use the features of report writing to write in the same style as the text and enhance our non-fiction writing. In SPAG we will focus on using brackets, dashes and commas for parenthesis. Our spelling rule is the suffix 'tion' and our 5 extra focus words are: college competent convenience curiosity diamond

### <u>Maths</u>

We will begin the week by completing our work on subtraction and how we calculate giving change, when using money. Our learning focus will then shift to multiplication strategies and we will be developing our knowledge of using short multiplication.

Regular, 'little and often' times table learning will be key in helping the children succeed here. On our Google Classroom page, there are links to games that can help.

### Other subjects

Year 6 will continue to develop their sewing skills on Monday afternoon and learn some wartime songs and the importance of music during WWII, ahead of our visit to Holdenby House on Thursday, In Spanish we will be learning more about music and expressing our likes and dislikes. Science next week will see us learning about and describing the ways nutrients and water are transported through the body. In computing we will be using software to begin record radio adverts. Our PE lessons will involve us doing more of our Lindy Hop moves. RE this week sees us continuing to explore the question of whether we can live in harmony with different religions.

Year 5 will have Forest School on Monday afternoon, and should be dressed in school uniform on the top half of their body with leggings or jogging bottoms on the lower half. They will need outdoor shoes that are not their school shoes with them too, which may get muddy.
