As you know we are in the process of joining the Oxford Diocese Buckinghamshire Schools Trust Academy (ODBST). When we spoke to parents at the beginning of the year about this we indicated that we were hopeful that we would be joining the trust at the beginning of this term. As with so many things however the legal processes which needed to be followed have moved rather slowly and therefore this has not happened. I have heard this week that a date of 1st October 2023 has now been agreed with Buckinghamshire Council and the DFE for the conversion and this is what is now being worked towards. There is still legal work to be done regarding the Land Transfer but hopefully this will be straightforward and not cause any delay to the October date.

Van Gogh Class News

This week the children have been very excited watching the caterpillars grow. We have been learning about the Life Cycle of a Butterfly and the children were introduced to the author of The Very Hungry Caterpillar, Eric Carle.

Phonics:

We are approaching the end of Phase 3 and the children have found the digraphs/trigraphs in Phase 3 tricky. Please continue to work with your child at home to consolidate reading words/sentences with these sounds. It is also important that they are confidently applying these sounds in their writing.

Week 7	This week we will be consolidating sounds and tricky words learnt to date.
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Reading:

Please continue to share books with the children as well as hearing them read. This week we have been learning about the key features of Non-Fiction text e.g. Contents Page, Glossary, and Index Page etc. The children have really enjoyed learning key facts about different things e.g. sharks, plants, occupations etc

Writing:

We are continuing to work the children extending sentences by using adjectives, starting to use a capital letter at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end. It is also important that the children are consistently applying the Phase 3 sounds and tricky words in their writing. Please continue to encourage the children to write at home.

Maths:

The children have really enjoyed learning to count in TENS. We have had fun learning about measuring. The children have used non-standard measures to measure objects around the classroom. Next week we will explore measure further by comparing weights and size of objects.

Topic:

The children have been very excited learning all about Eric Carle. We were inspired by a clip of Eric Carle doing his illustrations and next week will be creating our own artwork using the techniques he uses.

Monet

Monet Class has had a great week writing some super stories in English, working hard in maths on comparing numbers and informal assessments to identify gaps in learning. Next week we have slightly less planned than usual due to the Bank Holiday and our very exciting Coronation Day next Friday.

In English we will be introducing a new picture book and using this to explore imagery, characters and descriptions of a setting.

In maths Year 2 will be adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers and revising the best method to subtract. Year 1 will be focusing on subtraction and counting up to find a difference.

In science we will be continuing with our 'signs of spring' theme and will begin to collect data to compare though May and June. We will be looking at weather, temperature, rainfall and trees/plants.

Please remember to bring in reading books on Tuesday to be changed and a water bottle for the classroom. Please also make sure that all items of clothing are clearly named (and your child has brought their own clothing home) as some children's belongings have gone missing.

Maths

Year 3 have been fantastic with their money this week! They have looked at pounds and pence and converting between the two, they have also worked on adding and subtracting money. To develop their reasoning skills, all children have additional extension questions to extend their understanding further.


Year 4 have finished their work on decimals which has been a little bit tricky at times! They have started looking at money focusing on writing money as decimals and converting between pounds and pence.

English

The children have continued to enjoy reading Christophe's story. They have successfully drawn inferences from the text and used this information to explore the main characters of the story. Children have also taken great care with their writing; they imagined they were Christophe (the main character in the book) and wrote a letter to a fellow survivor telling him all about his experiences in Rwanda and England.

Topic

In Science, we have looked deeper into the classification of living things. This week children looked at the characteristics of mammals, birds, amphibians, fish and reptiles. In our next lesson will look at how environments can change and how these changes can pose dangers to living things.



In our computing sessions, we will be developing our word processing skills using Microsoft word. This week we learnt how to insert tables and adding rows and columns.

In PSHE, we will be looking at ways to keep physically healthy and will be focussing on the importance of sleep on our physical health.

RE – We will be looking more closely at features of places of worship and discussing similarities and differences.

Important Reminder

Please encourage your child to practice their times table daily. The Multiplication check will take place in June for year 4 children and will determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Hepworth

We've had a lovely week in Hepworth, and the children have worked hard. In particular, their enthusiasm for writing reviews of the Museum of Fun (both positive and negative) was lovely, and produced some really engaging writing.

With the Bank Holiday and Coronation celebrations, next week will probably fly by but we still have lots of learning to squeeze in! In English next week, the children will be focussing on comprehension exercises using skills such as skim and scan, inference, and looking at the structures and meanings of texts beyond just the words. The Spelling focus will be words ending in 'ant' and 'ancy' and SPaG will focus on root words.

In Maths, Hepworth will continue looking at statistics, presenting and interpreting information, including algebra for Year 6. They will also practice using co-ordinates when looking at position, reflection and translation in geometry.

We will be starting our new Topic, Coasts, by looking at the Water Cycle. Whilst in Computing, we will continue learning about how to create a website, in particular understanding copyright. And finally, in PE this week we hope to give the children time to relax with a yoga and fitness class.
