Class News

Van Gogh

Hope you have all had a good week! We are finally there... December and we have started to count down to Christmas.

<u>Phonics</u>

We are coming to the end of Phase Two, please continue to consolidate these sounds at home alongside the children's Phase 1 targets. We will continue to work on segmenting and blending, hearing initial/middle/end sounds and rhyme and consolidating Phase 1.

To support reading the children will be learning to sight read the tricky words alongside the sounds. Please use the material sent home last week in their reading pack to continue to reinforce these.

<u>Maths</u>

We have continued to work on mathematical vocabulary related to addition, learning how to read/write simple number sentences and make up stories using objects and drawings.

This week we will be chanting numbers to 10/20 and will be consolidating all numbers to 5:

Conservation of a number: Number of objects in a set does not change even when they are moved around.

Composition of a number: Number are made of two or more other smaller numbers involving a 'part' and a 'whole'. Learning to 'see' a whole number and its parts at the same time.

Subitise: Look at a group of objects and realis how many there re without counting.

- Number 5
- Counting out five Matching numerals to written and spoken numerals Pentagon (five straight sides and five corners) Using/adding different combination of coins to make 5p – ordinal numbers 5th – Number formation - 5 'o'clock.

Subitise numbers to 5 – Number Bonds to 5, partitioning number 5 and finding the different combinations e.g. 1+4 2+3 3+2 4+1

- Children count 1-10 on a number track (Can say one more/less than a number)
- Days of the week what come before... what comes after...?

Over the next few weeks we will be consolidating all the learning for numbers 1-5. Please support your child to continue to reinforce previous learning.

<u>Topic</u>

This week we have been learning about the importance of Advent in the Christian calendar, we have two advent calendar in the class so the children will be coming home with chocolate at some point. We have a busy few weeks ahead learning about the importance of Christmas, enjoying Christmas crafts, Christmas production and lots more.

The children in Monet Class have had a fun filled week decorating the classroom with snowflakes while practising their knowledge of halves and quarters and counting in 2s. We also made 'tricky word' paper chains and it was lovely to see the children working together as a whole class to try to make the longest paper chain they could!

Next week we will continue to write letters focusing on capital letters and question marks in English.

In Maths we will be confidently counting to 100, adding near multiples of 10, revising ordinal numbers (practise singing The 12 days of Christmas to help with this if you can!) and revising our number bonds to 10 and 20.

We will also be very busy with our dress rehearsal and two performances of our Christmas Play on Wednesday and Thursday. The children have all been working so hard with their lines and their singing and are very excited about performing to everyone.

We will also be continuing with our calendars and researching moving puppets/Christmas decorations to give us some ideas to create our own.

Home learning will be on Google Classroom.

Hockney

Next week in Hockney class we will be continuing our work on autobiographies, focusing on how we describe feelings in an autobiography and revising the past and present tense.

In Maths we will be wrapping up our work on times tables and division facts, trying to better understand how we can use known facts to work out unknown ones. We will be looking at times tables in different contexts, solving problems with arrays, other visual representations and within word problems.

In Art and Design and Technology we have begun our sewing project. The children have begun to learn the basics of sewing such as how to thread a needle and a few basic stitches. We will then build up these skills to create a Christmas bookmark.

In Geography next week we will wrap up our work on the Nile, exploring the uses of the river Nile and how these have changed over time. We will study the impact the river has had on trade within Egypt and again how this has altered over time.

In PSHE, we will be focusing on what is respectful behaviour, learning how to respect ourselves and others around us. The children will then be able to identify in different scenarios what makes for respectful and appropriate behaviour.

Alongside our normal lessons we will be practising songs for our carol concert as Christmas has crept up on us! The children have been working really hard in these sessions and we have some beautiful singing voices in Hockney class!

Hepworth

The children in Hepworth Class have had a great and busy week. They have worked hard in so many areas of their learning and had an enjoyable time cooking yesterday!



Next week will be another busy week for them as we near the end of term.

On Monday, Year 5 will have Forest school in the afternoon - please ensure they have suitable shoes and trousers to wear (leggings or jogging bottoms) on the lower part of their clothing, with usual school uniform on the top half.

English

It is assessment week for Year 6 next week. They will be assessed in their reading comprehension, grammar and spelling next week. Year 5 will focus on reading comprehension in class and different ways of answering comprehension questions about texts they read. Both year groups will complete some independent writing, based around WWII.

Maths

The focus for Year 6 will be assessments, which will include an arithmetic and two reasoning paper assessments. Year 5 will work on the objective of counting forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1 000 000. There will also be an opportunity to consolidate the children's learning of division and complete some problem solving questions relating to division.

Other subjects

There will be a focus on singing next week as we prepare for the KS2 carol service - expect some carol singing and humming at home!

We will also be having a Christmas craft day on Friday which will be for the full day.

In PSHE our work on knowing about appropriate and inappropriate touch will continue as we didn't finish this during the week just gone.

In Science, we will continue to explore how the circulatory systems fits together and works.

All children should also have taken home a letter about Secret Santa, along with a name of a child for them to buy a gift for. If your child hasn't spoken to you about this, please ask them about it and do contact us if you wish for any further details or information.
