We have had a busy week getting ready for Mothering Sunday.

Phonics:

The children are finding the digraphs in Phase 3 tricky. Please continue to work with your child at home to consolidate reading words/sentences with these sounds. Next week we will we be introducing week 6 butalso will be consolidating previous digraphs. Week 5 oo (look) oo (moon) ar or Tricky words: my you Week 6 ur ow oi ear Tricky word: they all are

Reading:

It is really important that you are reading with your child or sharing a book every day. This will not only build on their vocabulary and imagination but it will also help with apply their phonics to read and write more complex sentences. Also we would appreciate if all book are in every Thursday so that we can change books that have been read and look at reading records.

Writing:

We are continuing to work the children extending sentences by using adjectives, starting to use a capital letter at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end. The children also building on their tricky words and we are trying to encourage them to consistently apply these in their reading and writing. It is really important you continue to encourage the children to write at home.

Maths:

This week we will continue to consolidate number TEN and 3D shapes.

Topic:

Next week we will start to talk about the importance of Easter in the Christian calendar. Our key focus will be the Easter story and the start of new life.

The children in Monet are very excited about their trip to Chiltern Open Air Museum on Monday. Please drop your child off at the museum from 9.30 - 9.45 with a packed lunch that can be disposed of, a named water bottle and appropriate shoes and coat for walking in and the weather. Children to be collected from the museum between 2.45 and 3pm. In English for the rest of the week we will be focusing on writing a recount of our trip and writing clear instructions.

In maths Year 1 will be counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and creating arrays for multiples of 2, 5 and 10. Year 2 will be writing multiplication sentences to describe arrays, understanding that multiplication can be done in any order, understanding that multiplication is the inverse of division. Moving on to division with remainders.

In science we will be continuing to observe and record our seeds experiment and in geography we will be finding out more about the continent Europe and learning about some key features.

Hockney

Maths

Hockney class are growing in confidence with their understanding of maths. This week, Year 3 have been looking at mass and capacity. They have been using scales to read measurements and have been measuring in grams and kilograms. Year 4 have continued to work hard with fractions; they have now added fractions and mixed numbers and are starting to look at subtracting them.

English

Hockney class have continued to embrace poetry this week exploring rap as a different form of poetry. They have been acting out poems in rap style using clapping, tapping and stomping to emphasise rhythm and rhyme. Recently children have been working in groups comparing fairy-tale stories with rap versions; they are starting to plan their own rap version of a chosen fairy tale.

Topic

This week in Art, Year 4 put their drawing skills to the test with their Tudor portraits. They used tracing skills to start their portrait outline and pencils to add detail and colour.

Next week in Geography, we will be developing our geographical skills. We will be using Atlases to locate key places in Buckinghamshire.

In PSHE, we will be continuing our discussions about money and keeping track of our spending. This week we also discussed the *Electric Umbrella* performance and how important it to make everyone feel special and welcome regardless of their unique needs.

Hepworth

Another week has passed by quickly, but the children are still working hard in all subjects as well as diligently carrying out their responsibilities around the school.

In English this week, we are continuing with narrative poetry. Pupils will be reading a poem by Michael Rosen, Top Board, which also focuses on childhood memories. Later in the week our SPAG lesson we will be focussing on layout devices. Our spellings will look at the suffix – 'ible'.

In Maths, we are looking at the area of shapes that aren't rectilinear, as well as volume. Towards the end of the week we will be calculating angles and looking at angle sums for shapes. Our Science this week continues testing the properties of different materials such as wood, metal and chalk. Whilst in Computing, children will carry on sequencing their stories, as well as adding audio, in their animations.

Music for the week is based on a song 'Heal the Earth', which the children are enjoying and follows the theme of how music connects us to the environment.

Meanwhile, we will continue to learn about whole body fitness in PE.

In Topic we will continue with our work on mountains, whilst in DT we will be moving on to the next stage of our structures project. In PSHE we will be doing our final lesson on money and how to be a critical consumer.
