On Wednesday the children in school participated in 'The Rainbow Games'.


We were all impressed with the attitudes shown by the children and how well they displayed the values of the games; honesty, determination and accountability were very much present on the day.

Don't forget that the Community Fridge in Chesham is open on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 10.00 to 12.00 – it's next to Broadway Baptist Church. They redistribute surplus food to the general community that would otherwise become food waste.
